Student Academic Standing

Normally, a student who displays poor academic standing will be required to withdraw from the program unless the program recommends otherwise, and said recommendation is approved by the Director of Education or the President. A student will be given the chance to rewrite an exam if they receive a failing mark.

Poor academic standing is defined by the following condition:

1. A student who receives 68% or lower on theory and/or practical exams

In addition, poor attendance, as evidenced by timecards and attendance records will result in an initiation of student withdrawal...any monies that are loaned through student finance will be reimbursed to Student Finance by Delmar College pursuant to the Alberta Student Contract.

When any instance of poor academic standing arises, the Director of the Program (Hair or Esthetics) must submit a notice informing the Director of Education and the President of their recommendation.

The Director of Hair or Esthetics, after consultation with the Director of Education and the President, and/or supervisory staff concerned, may initiate the withdrawal of a student.

A student must have a minimum of 69% (commendable pass) in order to graduate.
